#### FIRST LESSON

Jacob left Beer-sheba and went toward Haran. He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. And the Lord stood beside him and said, "I am the Lord, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and to your offspring; and your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and all the families of the earth shall be blessed in you and in your offspring. Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, "Surely the Lord is in this place - and I did not know it!" And he was afraid, and said, "How awesome is this place! #### **SECOND LESSON**

Reader: A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh - for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ - if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labour pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. (Romans 8:12-25)

Jesus put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn." Then Jesus left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!"

#### **Liturgical texts:**

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#### Genesis 28:10-19a

The complex of stories that make up the third cycle in Genesis (ch 25:19-ch 36) is often called the Jacob Cycle since they focus largely on the second of Isaac and Rebekah's two sons, Jacob. He had been born gripping his older twin brother's heel, and was named Ya'agob (Jacob) which mean "he holds by the heel" or "he cheats." Jacob's whole life is marked by manipulation and cheating—of other people and even of God. The lectionary chooses to omit the major stories of how he cheats his brother, Esau: first of his birthright as older, in exchange for a dish of lentil soup (25:29-34); and then, aided by his mother, by deceiving his father and brother of the paternal blessing (ch 27). Forced by his angry brother to flee, Jacob sets out for Aram to find his mother's brother, Laban, with whom he hopes to live in safety. He reaches a spot that in later times sat on the boundary between the tribes of Benjamin and Ephraim, and at this boundary place he has a dream of a set of ascending steps (often translated as "a ladder"), perhaps something like an ancient ziggarut or temple reaching with great stone steps up toward heaven. In Jacob's dream, angels are going up from him, and coming back down. (Note here too the reversed order of what we would expect, so significant that in John's Gospel 1:43ff, Jesus alludes to this story when he calls the disciples Philip and Nathaniel.) As the story unfolds, in his dream God makes him a promise. On awaking, Jacob recognizes that he is in a holy place, and sets up a sacred marker stone, naming the place Beth-el, "House of God." But even this does not stop Jacob from driving a bargain with God—he sets conditions that God must meet if Jacob is to be loyal (28:20-21). In the larger biblical narrative the story is an etiology, a story that tells us about the origins of an important Israelite holy place and shrine at Bethel. But it also foreshadows a more intense meeting and struggle that Jacob will have when he finally comes back years later, and re-enters the land at the Wadi Jabbok on the east side of the Jordan.
