THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Reader: A Reading from the Book of Genesis

Eliezer said, "I am Abraham's servant. The Lord has greatly blessed my master, and he has become wealthy; he has given him flocks and herds, silver and gold, male and female slaves, camels and donkeys. And Sarah my master's wife bore a son to my master when she was old; and he has given him all that he has. My master made me swear, saying, 'You shall not take a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I live; but you shall go to my father's house, to my kindred, and get a wife for my son.' I came today to the spring, and said, 'O Lord, the God of my master Abraham, if now you will only make successful the way I am going! I am standing here by the spring of water; let the young woman who comes out to draw, to whom I shall say, "Please give me a little water from your jar to drink," and who will say to me, "Drink, and I will draw for your camels also" let her be the woman whom the Lord has appointed for my master's son.' Before I had finished speaking in my heart, there was Rebekah coming out with her water jar on her shoulder; and she went down to the spring, and drew. I said to her, 'Please let me drink.' She quickly let down her jar from her shoulder, and said, 'Drink, and I will also water your camels.' So I drank, and she also watered the camels. Then I asked her, 'Whose daughter are you?' She said, 'The daughter of Bethuel, Nahor's son, whom Milcah bore to him.' So I put the ring on her nose, and

the bracelets on her arms. Then I bowed my head and worshipped the Lord, and blessed the Lord, the God of my master Abraham, who had led me by the right way to obtain the daughter of my master's kinsman for his son. Now then, if you will deal loyally and truly with my master, tell me; and if not, tell me, so that I may turn either to the right hand or to the left." And they called Rebekah, and said to her, "Will you go with this man?" She said, "I will." So they sent away their sister Rebekah and her nurse along with Abraham's servant and his men. And they blessed Rebekah and said to her, "May you, our sister, become thousands of myriads; may your offspring gain possession of the gates of their foes." Then Rebekah and her maids rose up, mounted the camels, and followed the man; thus the servant took Rebekah, and went his way. Now Isaac had come from Beer-lahai-roi, and was settled in the Negeb. Isaac went out in the evening to walk in the field; and looking up, he saw camels coming. And Rebekah looked up, and when she saw Isaac, she slipped quickly from the camel, and said to the servant, "Who is the man over there, walking in the field to meet us?" The servant said, "It is my master." So she took her veil and covered herself. And the servant told Isaac all the things that he had done. Then Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent. He took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her. So Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.

SECOND LESSON

Reader: A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant: Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth; you are the source of light and life for all your creation, you made us in your own image, and call us to new life in Jesus Christ our Saviour. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, Father, according to his command,

Liturgical texts:

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Genesis 24:34–38, 42–49, 58–67

The narrative in today's reading tells of the search for a wife for Abraham's son Isaac. It is one of the longest chapters and single narrative units in the entire Hebrew Bible, and is

carefully structured around a series of repeated motifs, the servant's promises to Abraham and prayers to God, the fulfillment of the signs asked of God. The careful structuring suggests that this chapter may have been written at a late period, drawing on older traditions, to round out the Abraham cycle (Genesis 12-25:11) and emphasize key themes. Our lectionary selection picks up in the middle of the story, though because of the repetitions, we do hear many of the themes of the entire chapter. One is Abraham's desire that his son not go back to the land of Aram to the northeast (modern day Syria). Having made the choice to follow God's call to a new place, he wants the break with the old to be complete. But at the same time, the story draws on a later biblical theme, perhaps from the period of the return of the people to Judah in the Persian period. Abraham also does not want his son to marry into the Canaanite culture that now surrounds them. The story also emphasizes God's providence: the elderly servant prays that God will send a sign of the right bride, and suddenly Rebekah appears doing exactly as the servant had described. And surprise! she is a close relative of Abraham's so acceptable as a possible bride! As well, the story foreshadows a later development in the book. Her brother, Laban, tries to delay the servant from taking her back to be married, but she chooses to go. In the next cycle of stories, Rebekah's own son, Jacob, has to flee his brother's anger and spend time in Aram with his uncle, Laban, Laban also tries to prevent Jacob from returning to Canaan with his wives, Rachel and Leah, who are Laban's daughters.
