Proclamation of the Word

First Lesson

Reader: A Reading from the Book of Exodus

The LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron in Egypt: "This month is to be the first month of the year for you. Give these instructions to the whole community of Israel: On the tenth day of this month each man must choose either a lamb or a young goat for his household. If his family is too small to eat a whole animal, he and his next-door neighbor may share an animal, in proportion to the number of people and the amount that each person can eat. You may choose either a sheep or a goat, but it must be a one-year-old male without any defects. Then, on the evening of the fourteenth day of the month, the whole community of Israel will kill the animals. The people are to take some of the blood and put it on the doorposts and above the doors of the houses in which the animals are to be eaten. That night the meat is to be roasted, and eaten with bitter herbs and with bread made without yeast. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled, but eat it roasted whole, including the head, the legs, and the internal organs. You must not leave any of it until morning; if any is left over, it must be burned. You are to eat it quickly, for you are to be dressed for travel, with your sandals on your feet and your walking stick in your hand. It is the Passover Festival to honor me, the LORD. "On that night I will go through the land of Egypt, killing every first-born male, both human and animal, and punishing all the gods of Egypt. I am the LORD. The blood on the doorposts will be a sign to mark the houses in which you live. When I see the blood, I will pass over you and will not harm you when I punish the Egyptians. You must celebrate this day as a religious festival to remind you of what I, the LORD, have done. Celebrate it for all time to come." (Exodus 12:1-14)

Reader:Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church.All:Thanks be to God.

Psalm 148

Leader: Sing a new song to the LORD; praise him in the assembly of his faithful people!

All: Be glad, Israel, because of your Creator; rejoice, people of Zion, because of your king!

Leader: Praise his name with dancing; play drums and harps in praise of him.

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All: The LORD takes pleasure in his people; he honors the humble with victory.

- Leader: Let God's people rejoice in their triumph and sing joyfully all night long.
- All: Let them shout aloud as they praise God, with their sharp swords in their hands
- Leader: to defeat the nations and to punish the peoples; to bind their kings in chains, their leaders in chains of iron;
- All: to punish the nations as God has commanded. This is the victory of God's people. Praise the LORD!

Second Lesson

Reader: A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

Be under obligation to no one—the only obligation you have is to love one another. Whoever does this has obeyed the Law. The commandments, "Do not commit adultery; do not commit murder; do not steal; do not desire what belongs to someone else"—all these, and any others besides, are summed up in the one command, "Love your neighbor as you love yourself." If you love others, you will never do them wrong; to love, then, is to obey the whole Law. You must do this, because you know that the time has come for you to wake up from your sleep. For the moment when we will be saved is closer now than it was when we first believed. The night is nearly over, day is almost here. Let us stop doing the things that belong to the dark, and let us take up weapons for fighting in the light. (Romans 13:8-12)

Liturgical texts:

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Exodus 12:1-14

Exodus is the second book of the Jewish Torah (Instruction or Law), also sometimes referred to as the Pentateuch from the Greek name, "Five Books." Exodus recounts the story of God's bringing the Israelite people out of Egypt, forming them into a community and people, giving them a Law that will enable them to live in justice and

mercy, and enabling them to create a Tabernacle, a travelling Holy Space by which God can continue present with them as they journey. Today's reading leaps over the account of the great confrontation between Moses, called by God to lead the Hebrew people into freedom, and Pharoah, the hard-hearted ruler of Egypt, with its stateorganized slavery, oppression and genocide. Pharaoh imagines himself to be a god, and all-powerful, and despite a series of plagues that one by one attack the roots of the entire Egyptian economy of oppression and injustice, Pharaoh will not back down and set the Israelites free. In a final confrontation, God announces that as Pharaoh exists by the genocide of the Hebrew children, so all the firstborn of Egypt will be stricken dead in one night. Our reading today tells of the ritual meal the Israelites will eat before they flee Egypt, and will eat every year as an act of remembrance. Exodus 12-13 connects this meal of lamb with the blood marking the Hebrews' houses so that God will pass over them, with the rituals of a week of eating unleavened bread, and with the requirement that in perpetuity, the Israelites must consecrate all their firstborn males to God. All three rituals are reminders of God's mighty acts in delivering them from slavery into freedom. But the offering of the firstborn also serves as a permanent reminder that the cost of their freedom was the death of Egyptians.
