Acknowledgement of Traditional Territory: The land on which we gather is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee, and Anishinabek Nations, and the Mississaugas of the New Credit First Nation. This territory was the subject of the Dish-With-One-Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement between the Iroquois Confederacy and the Ojibwe and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

First Lesson 2 **Samuel** 11:26-12:13a

Reader: A reading from the second book of Samuel

When the wife of Uriah heard that her husband was dead, she made lamentation for him. When the mourning was over, David sent and brought her to his house, and she became his wife, and bore him a son. But the thing that David had done displeased the LORD, and the LORD sent Nathan to David. He came to him, and said to him, "There were two men in a certain city, the one rich and the other poor. The rich man had very many flocks and herds; but the poor man had nothing but one little ewe lamb, which he had bought. He brought it up, and it grew up with him and with his children; it used to eat of his meager fare, and drink from his cup, and lie in his bosom, and it was like a daughter to him. Now there came a traveler to the rich man, and he was loath to take one of his own flock or herd to prepare for the wayfarer who had come to him, but he took the poor man's lamb, and prepared that for the guest who had come to him." Then David's anger was greatly kindled against the man. He said to Nathan, "As the LORD lives, the man who has done this deserves to die; he shall

restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity." Nathan said to David, "You are the man! Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: I anointed you king over Israel, and I rescued you from the hand of Saul; I gave you your master's house, and your master's wives into your bosom, and gave you the house of Israel and of Judah; and if that had been too little, I would have added as much more. Why have you despised the word of the LORD, to do what is evil in his sight? You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword, and have taken his wife to be your wife, and have killed him with the sword of the Ammonites. Now therefore the sword shall never depart from your house, for you have despised me, and have taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your wife. Thus says the LORD: I will raise up trouble against you from within your own house; and I will take your wives before your eyes, and give them to your neighbor, and he shall lie with your wives in the sight of this very sun. For you did it secretly; but I will do this thing before all Israel, and before the sun." David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD."

Refrain: Create in me a clean heart, O God.

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your loving-kindness; in your great compassion blot out my offenses.

Wash me through and through from my wickedness and cleanse me from my sin. **Refrain**

For I know my <u>transgressions</u>, and my sin is ever <u>be</u>fore me. Against you only have <u>I</u> sinned and done what is evil <u>in</u> your sight. **Refrain**

And so you are justified when <u>you</u> speak and upright in <u>your</u> judgement. Indeed, I have been wicked from <u>my</u> birth, a sinner from my <u>mo</u>ther's womb. **Refrain**

For behold, you look for truth deep <u>with</u>in me, and will make me understand wis<u>dom</u> secretly. Purge me from my sin, and I shall <u>be</u> pure; wash me, and I shall be <u>clean</u> indeed. **Refrain**

Make me hear of joy <u>and</u> gladness, that the body you have broken may <u>rejoice</u>. Hide your face from <u>my</u> sins and blot out all <u>my</u> iniquities. **Refrain**

Create in me a clean heart, <u>O</u> God, and renew a right spirit <u>within</u> me.

Cast me not away from <u>your</u> presence and take not your holy Spi<u>rit</u> from me. Give me the joy of your saving help <u>again</u> and sustain me with your boun<u>tiful</u> Spirit. **Refrain**

Second Lesson Ephesians 4:1-16

Reader: A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Ephesians

I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people." (When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

2 Samuel 11:26-12:13a

During this season we are reading some of the stories from the books of Samuel. The collection of materials we know was likely gathered together and edited in the late monarchic or extrinityilic period, and as a whole has been framed with poems (1 Samuel 2 and 2 Samuel 22-23) that hold up the idea of the king who is the Anointed one, (the Mashiah) whose role is to create justice and hope in a world of power, hunger and oppression. The narrative of the book focusses on the period from about 1050-950 BCE during which the twelve tribes came under increasing pressure from the peoples living on the Gaza coast, as well as surrounding city states. Some key players in the second part of Samuel are: David, the ruthless gang-leader and enforcer from southern Judah who brings death and betrayal to almost everyone he encounters, yet somehow comes to be seen as Israel's greatest monarch and the father of a dynasty that will rule in Jerusalem for the next four centuries; Joab, David's key military commander and enforcer; Nathan, a figure who seems to have been a court prophet; and Absalom, David's son by a wife from northeastern Israel, who eventually leads a popular revolt against his father. Today's reading takes up where last week's reading left off. David has committed adultery with Bathsheba, the wife of Uriah the Hittite, one of his mercenary soldiers, and then had Uriah murdered after Bathsheba became pregnant. Now his court prophet, Nathan, whom we last heard relaying God's promise of a special covenant of an dynasty in perpetuity in 2 Samuel 7, shows up. He tells David a story, a sort of parable, about a great injustice done by a rich man to a poor. David responds with demands for punishment for the perpetrator, at which point Nathan goes full throttle expressing the disapproval of YHWH, Israel's God. In the ensuing chapter we begin to see the prophecy unfold, first with the death of the child, and then with the unravelling of David's family in rape, revenge killings, and rebellion by his oldest son, Absalom. For many modern readers, the notion that Bathsheba's baby must die in order to punish David also seems a divine injustice of horrific proportions, which the biblical narrative does not really resolve. It paves the way for the birth of Solomon, and many scholars refer to much of the narrative in 2 Samuel as the Succession Narrative, a propaganda document prepared for Solomon half a century later (perhaps around 950 BCE) to justify his coming to the throne and displacing David's other sons. 
